Today was much like the previous day, with officers being busy for a good portion of the day. In the beginning of the shift, TPD received a call from a female who said she was being assaulted and had armed herself with a weapon. She refused to tell dispatch what type she had and then refused to answer further questions. When officers arrived, they saw a group of 5 females arguing with each other. The caller demanded that we arrest the other 4 females and contact ICE. As officers were obtaining statements, the caller would make rude comments and disparaging comments towards the other females. It was found that she caller did not live in the area but drove here to drop off her garbage in a dumpster behind an apartment complex. She was seen by the residents yesterday doing the same thing and she was told that she could not use the complex dumpster. Today she decided to return and fill up the dumpster. The residents came out and started to take out the garbage that the caller placed in the dumpster, and return it to her car. The caller then started assaulting one of the female residents, which cause another of the residents to defend her. In the end, the original caller was arrested for assault & battery and illegal dumping.
